Because the port stay occurs during the Thanksgiving holiday, many services will be closed or limited. Many planned and independent options previously available to Semester at Sea participants will not be available (Pearl Harbor, Polynesian Cultural Center, etc.). Please plan your time accordingly.

HON01 OAHU GRAND CIRCLE ISLAND TOUR (0800-1630 Thursday, 27 November) Minimum 35/Maximum 55 (PRICE: \$61.00 + OOPEX)

This popular field trip takes you on a 120-mile journey around the beautiful island of Oahu. Enjoy the ride along the slopes of Diamond Head and see Hanauma Bay, Sandy Beach, Nuuanu Pali Lookout, Byodo-In Temple, the North Shore surfing beaches (Sunset and Pipeline) and Waimea Bay. Photo stops will be made along the way.



Continue with a visit to the Dole Plantation for a stroll through the Plantation Gardens. (A stop will be made for lunch, at your own expense.)

HON02 DIAMOND HEAD, RAINFOREST & SCENIC SHORES (0830-1230 Thursday, 27 November) Minimum 20/Maximum 25 (PRICE: \$36.00)



This field trip features Mt. Tantalus, Nuuanu Pali and scenic south island beaches via a premier mini-coach. It is specially designed to take in many of the most scenic vistas and natural attractions of Oahu in just a few hours.

Enjoy the view from Amelia Earhart Lookout on the slopes of Diamond Head. Ascend into the rainforest at the top of Mt. Tantalus. The panorama from Puu Ualakaa State Wayside is outstanding, and the views of Diamond Head, Waikiki and Honolulu are magnificent. View the Queen Emma Summer Palace and continue up into the cool, lush rainforest of Nuuanu Valley along Pali Drive.

Experience the summit of Nuuanu Pali Lookout. Amidst gusting winds, encounter the glorious vista of windward Oahu. Then enjoy the sea air and blustery trade winds along the coastline past Makapuu Point and Sandy Beach, to the Halona Blowhole. See the landmark Koko Head Crater and the beautiful Hanauma Bay, the incomparable marine preserve nestled in its own half-sunken volcanic crater.

HON03 SNORKELING ADVENTURE (0900-1530 Thursday, 27 November) Minimum 40/Maximum 110 (PRICE: \$85.00)

Board the *Ale Ale Kai V*, a casual two-deck motor vessel, to explore the azure waters off Waikiki. You will be provided with snorkeling equipment, instructions and a guided tour of the Rainbow Reef.

The *Ale Ale Kai V* has an open sun deck for relaxing and is equipped with a variety of water toys to enjoy. You will receive expert narration and marine life identification by the Captain and crew. Enjoy a freshly grilled BBQ lunch buffet with an open soda bar. Please note: Be sure to carry or wear your swimsuit with a cover up. Bring a towel and sunscreen.



HON04 HORSEBACK RIDE AT KUALOA RANCH (1000-1400 Thursday, 27 November) Minimum 25/Maximum 32 (PRICE: \$116.00 + OOPEX)

Travel to the beautiful Windward Coast to enjoy a few hours at Kualoa Ranch. En route to Kualoa, a stop will be made at Pali Lookout for a picturesque view of the Windward Coast.

The one- hour tour covers the southern half of the ranch. Vistas of the famed “Chinaman’s Hat” (Mokoli’i Island) and an ancient 800 year-old Hawaiian fishpond accompany the great feeling of spending time riding horses. Enjoy the fascinating views of the beautiful and colorful blue Pacific Ocean while riding. Please note: Participants must wear covered shoes and long pants. Sunscreen and a hat are recommended. Maximum weight is 230lbs.

HON05 SERVICE VISIT: SALVATION ARMY THANKSGIVING DINNER (1000-1500 Thursday, 27 November) Minimum 20/Maximum 20 (PRICE: \$12.00)

The Salvation Army will hold its 38th annual Thanksgiving dinner for Honolulu’s needy. Since its inception in 1971, the number of meals served has grown from 500 to 2,500. Attendees include the homeless, senior citizens and other community members who are in need.

Depart the pier for the community center to assist with various services including serving food or beverages, kitchen assistance and clean-up. Please note: Volunteers must be 16 years of age. Due to safety concerns, children may not accompany a volunteer. A donation to the Salvation Army has been included in the price of this program.
